### Mosaic Wall Restoration Project:

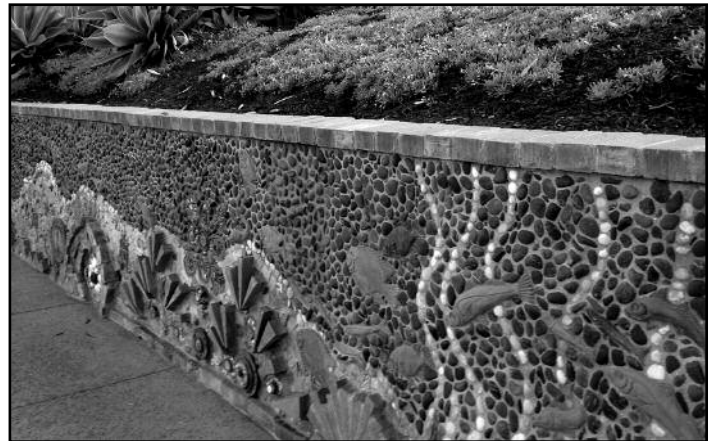
As you've walked along Camino Del Mar this year, you've probably seen a crew, headed by artist Betsy Schulz and gardener extraordinaire Pat Welsh, making much-needed repairs to the Mosaic Wall in front of the Del Mar Library.



The Del Mar Foundation served as the fiscal sponsor for this mosaic wall when it was originally installed in 2002-03, and we are pleased to be supporting the restoration work with both a direct grant and fiscal sponsorship.

### Del Mar Historical Society

On April 11, 1985, the Del Mar Foundation granted seed money to “the fledgling” Del Mar Historical Society to support its founding and initial operations. On January 3, 1986, Swede Throneson, President Pro Tem of the DMHS, sent a progress report to the Foundation, noting, “To date, we have incorporated as a non-profit organization, have saved Del Mar’s most historical structure from being destroyed, and are looking forward to our first General Membership Meeting.” Fast-forward to the present. The Del Mar Foundation has agreed to serve as fiscal sponsor of the DMHS, with responsibility for the Alvarado House Fund, which is intended to help fund the relocation of the Alvarado House once a permanent site for this “most historical structure” is secured. The Foundation will be managing this fund in much the same way it manages the Lagoon Endowment, which will be used to help maintain the environmental health of the San Dieguito Lagoon in the future.



## Del Mar Community Building Update

The Del Mar Foundation and Del Mar Community Connections are greatly benefitting from our offices and meeting spaces in the Del Mar Community Building, which we jointly renovated in 2012. Other community groups are using the meeting spaces as well, including the Friends of Del Mar Parks and the Del Mar Historical Society.
