If you have friends and neighbors who have not yet been to one of our events, we encourage you to reach out to them, suggest they join our mailing list, and let them know just how much this community has to offer.



Recent Grants

New Water Fountain at the Del Mar Community Building / Shores Park



The recent heat wave inspired the Del Mar Foundation to provide \$6,112 to the City for the purchase and imminent installation of a three-tiered drinking fountain - for people and pets - at Shores Park. The fountain, similar in style to other Del Mar drinking fountains, will be located in front of the Del Mar Community Building.

Recognizing that the City is currently underway with a Master Plan design process for Shores Park, the drinking fountain will be able to be relocated if necessary as a result of construction.

River Path Del Mar Winds its Way into our Hearts

In keeping with its mission to "improve beaches and parklands," the Del Mar Foundation recently approved a \$6,000 grant to the **San Dieguito River Valley Conservancy (SDRVC)** to help fund the ongoing Del Mar River Path Extension project.

According to Trish Boaz, Executive Director of SDVRC, "Together, the Conservancy and Del Mar Foundation have successfully raised funds for the River Path Del Mar, a project that will have a lasting positive impact on our community."

The River Path will provide a scenic overlook of the San Dieguito Lagoon and River and will include signage of the flora and fauna. The Extension Project extends River Path Del Mar from Jimmy Durante Boulevard east to the Old Grand Avenue Bridge.


